

Housing for All - A new Housing Plan for Ireland

Key objective remains that '...everyone in the State should have access to a
home to purchase or rent at an affordable price, built to a high standard and in
the right place, offering a high quality of life'.

- 2023 Update due for publication in coming weeks
- **33,000 new homes per annum until 2030 |** +300,000 total
- €4bn investment per annum
- 2022 completions (29,851) **surpassed target** (24,600)
- 2023 completions (14,017 in H1) on target (29,000)
- 2024 target is 33,450

- 4. Vacancy & Existing Stock







- Supported by Chapter 5 Enabling a Sustainable Housing System
- The housing system needs to be placed on a long-term economically sustainable footing. MMC has been identified as a key measure to enable productivity and the efficient delivery of housing. (Section 5.3 Achieve Economic Sustainability)

Construction Cost & Productivity


- Recent analysis residential construction costs account for about 50% development costs.
- Productivity in the construction sector remains below 2010 levels and is less productive than EU average.


Related Innovation Activities

- State to play a central role in **leading and funding these actions** to ensure that levels of productivity and innovation materialise.
- Complemented by an increased focus for the Department of Public
 Expenditure, National Development Plan Delivery and Reform (PENDR)
 and Construction Sector Group (CSG) on the residential construction

 sector.
- Complemented by role of Enterprise Ireland, which will be expanded to include the provision of funding and supports for innovation and productivity-related projects in the domestic residential construction

- Formed 2020 to support the delivery of Project
 Ireland 2040
- Increased focus on residential construction
- Chair: SecGen of PENDR
- Members: Representatives of key industry bodies and senior representatives of Government departments & agencies with responsibility for policy & for the delivery of infrastructure






MMC Leadership & Integration Group (MMC LIG)

HfA Action 13.2 – MMC Roadmap

'Develop an incremental roadmap with targets for compliant MMC adoption in publicly procured residential construction, working with the OGP, to include inter alia consideration of the tender and evaluation process; design standardisation; skills development and the sharing of best practice; project aggregation; further MMC test projects; and sustainability and circular economy principles. The provision of a public procurement roadmap for MMC will build capacity in the supply chain with resulting delivery and cost reduction benefits.'


MMC Terminology

 concrete and other materials.






MMC Roadmap


Roadmap to enable increased adoption of MMC in Public Housing Delivery

- Published July 2023
- 28 milestones under 6 themes
- Theme 1: Procurement Approaches
- Theme 2: Regulations & Standards
- Theme 3: Capital, Finance and Insurance
- Theme 4: Skills Development
- Theme 5: Industry Competitiveness and Capacity
- Theme 6: Policy Execution and Communication



Theme 1: Milestone 1: Accelerated SH Delivery Programme

- €100M fund in Dec 2022 to write-off of LA Land Legacy Debts
- Some exemptions from Part 8 Planning Process
- Commitment from LAs to be on site by end of 2024
- Commitment to procure projects utilising HA procurement guidance published April 2023
- 30+ sites, 1500+ dwellings in 13 LAs being progressed
